## LEARNING GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

1. Develop a better understanding of available diagnostic imaging modalities for the diabetic foot.
2. Develop a better understanding of surgical management of Charcot arthropathy.
3. Learn to perform a Lapidus procedure with a less invasive technique, and to build a fixation construct to allow early weight bearing.
4. Learn how to perform tendon transfers for digital deformities.
5. Develop a better understanding of locking plate theory, indications for use and techniques.
6. Describe approaches and techniques for midfoot fusions.
7. Become more familiar with work-up and management of 2nd MPJ subluxation.
8. Understand current 1st MPJ fusion techniques.
9. Become more familiar with Revisional Achilles tendon repair – when and how to perform surgery.
10. Understand indications and techniques for bi-lobed skin flaps.
11. Learn current approaches to surgical management of pes planovalgus.
12. Improve correction obtained with distal metatarsal bunionectomies.
13. Improve clinical outcomes in PAD patients through a multidisciplinary approach.
